How is my tax bill calculated?

City Council approves the Operating Budget. After deducting grants, sales and user fees, the remaining amount is collected through property taxes. Your share of this amount is based on the assessed value of your home.

Supplementary tax bill

- Issued for new buildings or additions
- Calculated based on months completed/ occupied in tax year
- Mailed out end of October 2025

Budgeted municipal tax changes

- Zero Increase: 2020, 2021, 2022
- **Average Increase:** <2.8% per year (2019-2026)

Additional Taxes on your Tax Notice

The City of Lethbridge collects taxes on behalf of the Government of Alberta and the Green Acres Foundation. This is not additional City revenue. The City's role is strictly billing and collection, with no control over their budgets, allocations or operations.

Alberta Education Tax (24¢)

Education tax supports the public and separate school boards. The Government of Alberta determines budget and amount of education tax each municipality in Alberta will pay.

Tax Year	Requisition Percentage Change
2023	▲ 3.2%
2024	▲ 6.1%
2025	▲ 13.8%

The 13.8% increase in 2025 contributes to equitable funding for K-12 education in the city. The provincial education requisition also plays a key role in supporting the city's growing student population.



Green Acres Foundation is a provincial non-profit housing management body. This tax funds the operations of their senior facilities and support services. The budget is set by the **Green Acres** Foundation.

Tax Year	Requisition Percentage Change
2023	▲ 5.4%
2024	4 .5%
2025	4.1 %

The 4.1% increase in 2025 supports the maintenance, upgrades and expansion of affordable housing for the growing senior population in the community.
